How To Apply

- Step 1- Connect with our foster home recruiter: <u>fosterinfo@nextdoorinc.org</u> and 541-308-2207
- Step 2- Submit an application here
- Step 3- Attend an online orientation (staff will schedule after receiving your application)
- Step 4- Begin certification paperwork and training process

Minimum Requirements for Foster Parents

- 21 years of age or older
- Pass a fingerprint-based background check
- Have an extra bedroom in the home, dedicated to foster youth
- Live in Hood River County or Wasco County
- Have adequate transportation for appointments and emergencies
- Ability to work as a team with staff, and other service providers

The Next Door Provides:

- 24-hour on-call support
- Trauma-informed training, including a monthly meeting for support and training
- Two paid days-off per month (respite)
- Financial support of about \$2100/month, per-youth (non-taxed)
- \$500 bonus after training is complete and a youth is placed in the home
